Leonardo da Vinci

Other clever inventors, such as Benjamin Franklin and Thomas Edison, also invented things, but they were not artists. They did not paint great paintings.

Leonardo's most famous painting is 'The Mona Lisa', and we can see it in Paris, France. He painted the portrait in 1503. 'The Mona Lisa' is a painting of a woman. Nobody knows who she was. Millions of people visit the Louvre Museum in Paris to see it. He also painted The Last Supper in 1495 and The Virgin of the Rocks in 1483. He died in France in 1519.
